Rules & Guidelines:

*NCSU welcomes all Wake County High Schools to Participate in the Annual Todd Fuller Competition.
(Public, NCAIS, or Charter)*

Location & Time: The Contest will be held in Harrelson Hall room 307 from 9:00am to 11:00am (This is a time change from years past)

Rules & Guidelines:

- Each school team may have up to six members and one alternate, totaling to seven teammates.
- You are permitted to have fewer students however you may be at a disadvantage when the winning teams are determined.
- All participants must be graduating seniors.
- All 7 students may participate in the contest and all participants (including alternates) are competing for the individual prizes.
- Students may bring with them:
 - 1) A permissible calculators (see list below of permissible calculators)
 - 2) A pencil.
- Students will be provided scratch paper.
- Students will be given 1 hour to complete the test.

Determining the Winners:

- Winning Teams are determined by the sum of the scores of the six team members (excluding the alternate's score). The winning teams receive a plaque presented to their school as well as their name engrave on a plaque, permanently showcased in the Mathematics building at NCSU.
- Individual Winners: The 1st, 2nd, and 3rd, highest scores (including all alternates' scores) will receive cash awards.
** Other top scorers are also offered scholarships (contingent on being accepted to NCSU and registering as a PAMS major).

Permissible Calculators:

Types of calculators permitted:

- Almost any four –function, scientific, or graphing calculator.

Types of calculator NOT permitted:

- Hand-held minicomputers or laptop computers
- Electronic writing pads or pen-input devices
- Pocket organizers
- Calculators with QWERTY (typewriter-like) keypads
- Calculators with paper tape
- Calculators that “talk” or make unusual noise
- Calculators that require an electrical outlet

For Example, a TI 83 is acceptable, but TI 89 is not.
